Summary: The Orlando Union Rescue Mission is a non-profit, faith based organization whose mission is to serve the homeless of Central Florida by supplying basic needs (including hot meals, safe shelter, and clean clothing) and rehabilitative services (including education and job training, Christian counseling, and case management mentoring) to help homeless men, women, and children achieve self-sufficiency. The foundation of our work is Biblically based—to bring people to know the Lord Jesus as their personal Savior.

The Orlando Union Rescue Mission does not receive any government funding and is entirely supported by generous contributions from the community.

Our Programs/Services:

- Emergency/overnight shelter for single men
- Long term transitional housing for men and women, single mothers, single fathers and in-tact families
- Discipleship Work Training Program
- High School Diplomas and career training
- Christian mentoring
- Daily Bible studies and chapel services
- Personalized biblical case management

# O.U.R. Programs and Facilities

Since 1948, the Orlando Union Rescue Mission has been bringing the hungry, hurting, and homeless to new life, new goals, and a new future in Christ by providing food, clothing, shelter, education, and other services to help homeless men, women, and families achieve self-sufficiency. The foundation of our work is Biblically based—to bring people to know the Lord Jesus Christ as their personal Savior.

Our services include (but are not limited to):

## **O.U.R. Mission Home, 1525 W. Washington Street**



O.U.R. Mission Home is a 192 bed transitional housing facility where homeless families, single women, single fathers and single mothers can rebuild their broken lives in a home-like atmosphere. The heart of our program is a biblical counseling and case management system which helps guests design a practical plan for getting back on their feet permanently. The Arthur J. and Marie H. Williams Family Life Center is located adjacent to O.U.R. Mission Home. This 23,000 sq. foot facility includes three classrooms, computer labs, Youth Learning Center, adult high school, Microsoft and IT Certification training, Early Learning Center, gymnasium, beauty salon, and school-aged tutoring room.

## **Moody Chapel and Activity Center, 1815 W. Washington Street**

The newest addition to the Orlando Union Rescue Mission is the Moody Chapel and Activity Center. Completed in 2012, it is designed to help residents and community members strengthen their journey with Christ. As residents work to rebuild their lives, the chapel provides the spiritual support they need to gain permanent independence built upon a personal relationship with Christ.



## **O.U.R. Men's Center, 410 W. Central Boulevard**



This facility includes an 80-bed emergency shelter and a work rehabilitation program for 40 additional men who are committed to changing their lives for good. Each man is provided food, clothing, and shelter and is also ministered to spiritually through nightly chapel services, Bible studies, and Christian mentoring.

## **O.U.R. Mission Bargain Store and Boutique, 911 W. Central Boulevard**

The Bargain Store and Boutique serves a host of very important purposes. It provides reasonably priced items for the general public, a source of revenue to help operate the Mission and clothing and household items free of charge to the needy and those on the Mission's programs. The Bargain Store also provides job training for those on the Mission's work rehabilitation program.
